



DOMAINE CHANDON HISTORICAL TIMELINE



1973 Moët & Chandon, under the venerable Moët Hennessy, establishes M & H Vineyards, later named Domaine Chandon, on March 26

1975 The first cuvées are bottled in the spring

1976 M & H registers its new winery name, Domaine Chandon

1976 The first 2000 cases of Napa Valley Brut are released in December just in time for the holidays

1977 The winery hosts a formal dedication on April 23, and opens to the public on April 25

1977 The first Blanc de Noirs from Chandon and the first in the U.S. to have a blush color is released

1977 The Restaurant at Domaine Chandon opens in June

1978 Domaine Chandon launches its tradition of celebrating Bastille Day, an appropriate salute to the company's French heritage

1979 Domaine Chandon sells its one millionth bottle of sparkling wine

1983 By Domaine Chandon's 10th anniversary, some 7,000,000 bottles of its wines have been opened and enjoyed

1991 The first étoile Brut is released

1995 The first vintage-dated sparkling wines are produced, a 1995 Vintage Brut and 1995 Blanc de Blancs

1997 The first étoile Rosé is released

1999 Chandon releases its classic tier Rosé and Vintage Mount Veeder Blanc de Blancs, now a brut

1999 Chandon introduces special wines for the millennium: Cuvée 2000 Late Disgorged, and 2000 Brut Cuvée and Blanc de Noirs in "millennium" magnums

2003 Domaine Chandon celebrates its 30th anniversary

2003 Chandon Extra-Dry Riche and Sparkling Red wines are released

2006 The Restaurant at Domaine Chandon is renamed as étoile Restaurant

2006 Chandon releases its first Reserve Blanc de Blancs

2009 Vintage Yountville Brut is released

2010 Vintage Carneros is released

2011 The first vintage étoile Tête de Cuvée is released

2013 Domaine Chandon celebrates 40th anniversary

2015 Domaine Chandon reinvents the restaurant into an exclusive visitor space
